We write regarding the U.S. Department of Labor's (DOL) Notice of Proposed Rulemaking released on April 14th with respect to proposed changes to who is a "fiduciary" of an employee benefit plan under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). This proposed rule, the "Definition of the Term "Fiduciary"; Conflict of Interest Rule—Retirement Investment Advice; Proposed Rule," if allowed to move forward, would have significant impacts on the retirement security of millions of Americans. Due to the complex nature and far-reaching effects of this proposed rule, we respectfully request the comment period be extended to a total of 120 days to ensure relevant stakeholders are able to provide thoughtful comments.
