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General Comment

The HHS decision to include full coverage for contraception services and counseling as preventive services is the result of sound judgment about what is good for all society. Allowing certain faithbased

organizations to avoid this statute is, in fact, promoting the private interests of one religion—or even one conservative element of that religion—over the consciences of employees. This does not further their special mission to help the common good. Ironically, when the bishops claim to lobby for religious

freedom, they are ignoring the moral agency of all the women who would benefit from contraceptive coverage. In addition, they are skirting the fact that few Catholics agree with them about the provision

and use of family planning.
