Updated Masking Guidance

This message is intended for all DOL employees and contractors.

We are encouraged to see that more Americans have received the COVID-19 vaccination – science continues to demonstrate that vaccination can both limit transmission and protect vaccinated people.

In accordance with the CDC's updated <u>Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People</u> and guidance from OMB, fully vaccinated Federal employees, fully vaccinated onsite contractors, and fully vaccinated visitors to Federal buildings are no longer required to wear masks.

As a reminder, the other components of the DOL <u>COVID-19 Workplace Safety Plan</u> – including maximum telework and workplace occupancy limits – remain in place. We will continue to update our Plan based on federal government and public health guidance.

To clarify what this announcement means for individuals:

- If you are fully vaccinated (at least 2 weeks past your final dose), you are no longer required to wear a mask.
- If you are not fully vaccinated (at least 2 weeks past your final dose), please continue to wear a mask consistent with the requirements set forth in DOL's COVID-19 Workplace Safety Plan.

These changes are consistent with <u>Executive Order 13991 on Protecting the Federal Workforce and Requiring Mask-Wearing</u>, which charged Federal agencies to "require compliance with CDC guidelines with respect to wearing masks" and with OMB memorandum <u>M-21-15</u>, which noted in its guidance on face masks that "agencies may provide for exceptions consistent with CDC guidelines."
