<b>PROJECT OBJECTIVES</b>	<p>Development Objective: The program will contribute to the generation of reliable data to develop effective interventions against child labor.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. At the end of the program, quantitative and qualitative data on child labor will have been produced, processed, analyzed and disseminated.</li></ol>
<b>SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES</b>	<p>Research design: A sample of 30,000 households selected throughout the country, and conducted as part of the General Household Survey of the Federal Office of Statistics.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Conduct household survey module to investigate child labor practices in Nigeria through a set of surveys administered to households, employers, and street children;</li><li>• Increase the capacity of the Federal Office of Statistics to collect quantitative information that is critical for planning action against child labor; and</li><li>• Enhance the knowledge of the government and general public about child labor in order to promote a sustainable campaign against the practice.</li></ul>
