year-olds in East and Southeast Asia.

> 7,789 children from hazardous work in the sectors of brick-making, portering, rubber-making, domestic work, salt production, fishing, and the service sector.

- Targeted interventions: by the end of the project, integrated, effective and sustainable responses to fight against WFCL are in place in selected provinces to serve as pilot models.
- Provided training on ways to build linkages between institutions implementing the National Plan of Action to eliminate child labor;
- Enhanced national and provincial capacity to engage, plan, and coordinate efforts between government and NGOs;
- Raised awareness of *prakas* (ministerial decrees)
