## **About Us**

The purpose of the National Farmworker Jobs Program is to strengthen the ability of migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their dependents to acquire necessary skills to either stabilize or advance in their agricultural jobs or obtain employment in new industries. Additionally, the program aims to increase access to safe and sanitary housing to assist migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their dependents with achieving their education and career goals, which can lead to improved economic mobility.

## NFJP By the Numbers

- Approximately \$90 million funds career services and training grants
- ◆ In program year 2022, 11,407 participants, including 8,128 adults and 3,279 youth, received career services and training

- ◆ Approximately \$6.5 million funds housing grants
- ◆ In program year 2022, 2,441 eligible migrant and seasonal farmworkers and 499 families received permanent housing services, 6,375 eligible migrant and seasonal farmworkers and 1,300 families received temporary housing services
