SUBJECT: Native American Employment and Training Council Nominations

- Purpose.** To request Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Section 166 grantees to submit nominations for consideration by the Secretary of Labor for appointment to fill expiring terms of membership on the Native American Employment and Training Council (Council).
- Reference.** WIA, Section 166(h)(4).
- Background.** The current Council Charter was renewed for two years, effective June 2005. The charter provides for approximately 21 members appointed for two years by the Secretary of Labor. Appointments for the following fifteen (15) members will expire on August 23, 2006:

4. **Action.** The Secretary of Labor may consider nominations for appointment to the Council submitted by Section 166 grantees. All members listed above are still eligible for nomination. The Division of Indian and Native American Programs will accept nominations electronically submitted to brown.athena@dol.gov.

Section 166 grantees in Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, Alaska, and Oklahoma may submit nominations for vacancies or expiring memberships in their own areas only. The Department of Labor (the Department) will accept for consideration from all Section 166 grantees nominations to fill seats on the Council representing “Other Discipline” memberships. Indian tribes and Indian, Alaskan Native, and Native Hawaiian organizations that do not administer a Section 166 grant may also submit nominations. Self nominations will be considered and grantees participating in the “477” initiative are eligible for appointment to the Council.

In submitting nominations, grantees should consider the willingness of the nominee to attend and participate actively in Council meetings, serve on Council workgroups, and provide feedback to the grantee community. Communication between the Council member and his/her constituency is critical to the partnership between the Department and the Indian and Native American community.
