SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 Alien Labor Certification Grants – State Workforce

Agency Allocations Under Continuing Budget Resolution Effective

Through December 31, 2007

 <u>Purpose</u>. To advise State Workforce Agencies (SWAs) of their Alien Labor Certification (ALC) grant allocations under the FY 2008 Continuing Resolution (CR) in effect December 22, 2007, through December 31, 2007.

3. <u>Background</u>. Each fiscal year, upon the enactment of appropriations legislation for the Department of Labor, the Employment and Training Administration (ETA), through the Office of Foreign Labor Certification, advises SWAs on the ALC grant distribution for the fiscal year, subject to submission and approval of workplans and meeting other criteria for funding. ETA guidance is designed to assist SWAs in their financial planning and, assuming ETA approves their workplans, to outline each state's procedural and programmatic obligations under the grant.

The Congress authorized and the President signed a CR to fund Government operations at the FY 2007 rate from December 22 through December 31, 2007. Two previous CRs funded programs from October 1 through December 21, 2007. With respect to the Department of Labor, the CR included funding for state ALC activities under the Department's State Unemployment Insurance Employment Service Operations account. The attachment to this TEGL lists the grant allocation for each state under that CR.

Based on longstanding practice, now that the Department has received a final FY 2008 appropriation, it will issue detailed planning guidance to SWAs. For SWAs planning to apply for FY 2008 ALC funding or that have, by the time final guidance issues, used ALC funding distributed under an FY 2008 CR, the issuance of the planning guidance triggers an obligation to immediately submit a workplan in order to demonstrate continuing eligibility under the annual grant.

Following the issuance of this TEGL, SWAs will receive additional information from the ETA Office of Grants and Contracts Management as their respective allocations become available for their use.

- 4. **Effective Date.** This guidance is effective immediately.
- 5. <u>Action Required</u>. SWA Administrators are directed to provide SWA staff involved in foreign labor certification activities with a copy of these procedures.
