SUBJECT: Labor Surplus Area List for Fiscal Year 2002

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To announce the release of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2002 Labor Surplus Area (LSA) list. The LSA list is published on the following websites: <u>www.doleta.gov</u> and <u>www.usworkforce.org</u>. It will no longer be published in <u>Area Trends</u>. On December 31, 2001, the list was published in the <u>Federal Register</u>. Unfortunately, the publication contained errors including omission of the City of Miami, Florida; listed Port St. Lucie City, County of St. Lucie Florida in the wrong county and spelled Yuma Arizona as Luma. The FY 2002 list will be republished in the <u>Federal Register</u>, in the near future. The list included on the websites does not contain these errors.
- 2. <u>Background</u>. Pursuant to Executive Order 12073 as implemented in 20 CFR 7654, the Secretary of Labor is required to classify LSAs for use by Federal executive agencies in directing procurement activities in areas of high unemployment. This list is updated during the year when areas become eligible based on exceptional circumstances as determined using specific criteria. The Department of Labor has published the list of eligible labor surplus areas annually in Area Trends.
- 3. <u>Labor Surplus Area List</u>. ETA had made some changes in the publication of the LSA list. Effective FY 2002, the LSA list will be published in the <u>Federal Register</u> at the beginning of the year and when any changes are made during the year. The list will also be maintained on the ETA website: <u>www.doleta.gov</u> and the <u>www.usworkforce.org</u> website. The list will no longer be published in <u>Area</u> Trends.
