- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To announce upcoming Technology-Based Learning Forums, during which ETA will share its Technology-Based Learning (TBL) Initiative vision, and explore the use, benefits, and challenges of technology-based learning in the workforce investment system to develop the talents of the American workforce in the 21st century global economy.
- 2. <u>Reference</u>. Workforce Investment Act of 1998; <u>Technology-Based Learning Strategies Report</u>
- 3. Background. Technology-based learning (TBL) can play a vital role in helping workers acquire the training they need to be successful in today's global economy and in increasing America's economic competitiveness and growth. The TBL Initiative seeks to increase the number of people trained by broadening the opportunities for skill and competency development made available through the use of technology-based learning (e-learning) methodologies. In addition, ETA is advancing the use of technology for training within the workforce investment system to help address the talent development needs in regional economies across the country. The goal is to use TBL or e-learning to move workers into high growth, high demand occupations and meet the needs of industry for skilled employees. ETA will conduct TBL Forums to share the vision of the TBL Initiative and to explore the use, benefits, and challenges of technology-based learning in the workforce investment system. Forum participants will include workforce investment system staff and partners such as education, economic development and business partners.

- Presentations from ETA on its vision of the Technology-Based Learning Initiative
- Overview of TBL (e-learning) Technologies
- Panel discussion on TBL (e-learning) in the workforce investment system, featuring workforce investment system representatives from the Region
