- **1.** <u>Purpose</u>. To announce the release and availability of the *Significant Provisions of State Unemployment Insurance Laws*, effective July 2018.
- **2.** Action Requested. The Employment and Training Administration (ETA) requests the State Workforce Agencies make sure all appropriate staff members are aware of the release of this publication and are aware of its location on the ETA website.

## 3. Summary and Background.

- a. Summary The U.S. Department of Labor publishes biannual editions of the *Significant Provisions of State Unemployment Insurance Laws* that provide key program data on unemployment insurance benefits and taxes in the states.
- b. Background The July 2018 edition has been finalized. This publication provides information on each state's wage requirements for unemployment insurance benefit eligibility, computation and amount of the weekly benefit, number of allowable benefit weeks, and the amount of earnings that will be disregarded for those individuals who are working part-time. It also provides information on the size of employer payroll required to pay unemployment taxes, the amount of wages subject to unemployment taxes, and the tax rates specific to each state's program.
