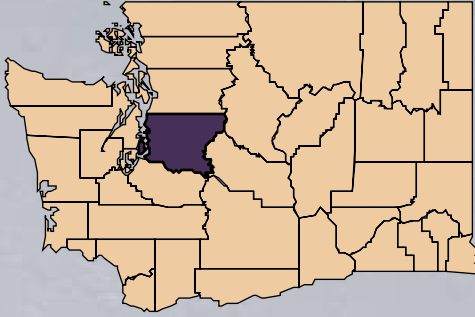


National Health Emergency Dislocated Worker Grants

Project Overview

The proposed funds will provide disaster-relief jobs, along with employment and training services, to eligible individuals in the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe (MIT) service delivery areas affected by the health and economic effects of widespread opioid use, addiction, and overdose.

Project Description

This grant will provide eligible participants in the MIT community located in northwestern Washington with disaster-relief employment as Peer Support Navigators, who help opioid-affected individuals navigate community resources to improve the rate of recovery, and as Child Care Workers and Certified Nurse Assistants, who provide services to alleviate the impact of the crisis on children and elders whose caretakers are in recovery. The project will also provide employment and training services to individuals affected by the opioid crisis with a focus on work experience opportunities and soft skills training.
