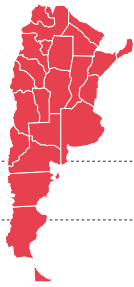




▶ 2021 We Multiply Commitment. We Deepen Action.

On the International Year for the Elimination of Child Labor from the project "[Offside: Marking the Field](#)", introduced by the ILO Country Office for Argentina, we deepen the collective and institutional commitment to prevent and eradicate child labor in the agricultural sector.

Strategic Knowledge for Public Policies



In different areas of the country, we carried out different research projects to provide evidence and key information for the development of programs and policies.

▶ Seven research studies.

▶ 300 people and 30 institutions consulted.

▶ 21 provinces covered in territorial survey.

Access to Water and Child Labor. We published and disseminated together with INTA, a [study](#) about the implementation of technologies to access water in reducing child labor in rural areas.

187 ▶ rural households.

497 ▶ children and adolescents survey across the country.

▶ The hours spent by the families providing and carrying water were reduced in a 50%

Communities Leadership. In the World's Water Week event organized by Stockholm International Water Institute (SIWI), we presented [materials](#) (together with INTA) about the impact of water access technologies in the quality of life and rights of rural communities and indigenous people from Argentina.

Management Tools for Prevention



Together with Ministry of Agrarian Development of the province of Buenos Aires we launched a "Dynamic Map of Agricultural Work".



Together with COPRETI of the province of Buenos Aires we started to implement a Management Portal for Prevention and Eradication of Child Labor in the Horticultural Sector.

Territorial Capacity Development



▶ We have designed and implemented, together with RENATRE, a specific training [project](#) for the prevention of child labor and protection of adolescent labor in the agricultural sector for of INTA and SENASA agents.

▶ We have created, together with INTA an operator's manual with a decent work perspective to respect identity and rights of the indigenous people of Argentina

▶ We trained community leaders and agents from Buenos Aires, Mendoza and Santa Fe as facilitators in Financial Education for the Rural Economy.
