

DAR-CE Method

A Novel Approach

A training and awareness-raising method to prevent and eradicate child labor and its worst forms, based on the methodology of popular education and cascade training.

Stages

The DAR-CE method gets its name from the acronym formed by the verbs of the five stages in which it is developed:



DESCRIBE each participant's reality.



ANALYZE and identify beliefs, attitudes and practices.



REFLECT on lessons learned from the fulfillment of rights.



COMMIT, visualize and design how we would like our reality to be in order to change.



EVALUATE commitments made, and return to reality.



Popular Education


- Goes beyond knowledge transfer.
- A participatory and transformative teaching-learning process.
- ▶ Based on the participating individuals' and groups' experience and context.
- Uses of oral resources such as reflection, dialogue and roleplaying.
- ► Employs critical analysis, awareness-raising and promotes collective and transformative action.
- ▶ It is based on the concept that people have the potential to commit to their reality and transform it.





Personal Strategy

▶ Meetings were held in 10 provinces. The country's institutions involved continue to replicate DAR-CE in the remaining provinces.



- ▶ Participants reflect on child labor and make individual and collective commitments to prevent and eradicate it.
- ▶ Reflections are based on previous knowledge, the reality they live within their communities and their individual potential.
- ► This makes it possible to make transcendental changes for the prevention and eradication of child labor and its worst forms in the most common sectors:







