

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▶ Introduction

The questionnaire for child labour modular surveys is meant to measure child labour according to the amended international standards adopted by the 20th International Conference of Labour Statisticians (2018). The questionnaire is designed to have a limited number of questions so that it can be incorporated as a module in surveys on more general topics such as labour force surveys or household living conditions surveys.

The questionnaire is shown in the annex of the present note. It is structured in five parts as follows:

Parts B is based on the ILO Model LFS questionnaire for PAPI Approach 1 (version 3) July 2019, developed by the ILO for the measurement of employment and labour underutilization of the working age population according to the 19th ICLS Resolution concerning statistics of work, employment and labour underutilization (2013).² The ILO LFS model questionnaire has been simplified and adapted to the situation of children.

For the purpose of the international standards concerning statistics of child labour, children comprise all persons in the age group from 5 to 17 years, where age is measured as the number of completed years at the child's last birthday, identified by the questionnaire in terms of

In principle, the questionnaire should measure the engagement of children in different forms of work during a specified reference week as shown below. Children may be engaged in more than one form work during the same reference period.

According to the 20th ICLS Resolution, "working children are those who were engaged in any activity falling within the general production boundary as defined in the 2008 System of National Accounts (SNA)." This means that "working children" comprise all children below 18 years of age engaged in activity to produce goods or to provide services for use by others or for own use. In terms of the questionnaire these may be identified by

The questionnaire should also measure the child labour and its three components of child labour as follows:

Finally, the questionnaire should provide the base for comparing the results of surveys based on the amended international standards and the earlier international standards adopted by the 18th ICLS (2008).³


