ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER RESCINDING PRIOR POSTPONEMENT ORDER

Due to the improvement of conditions in Florida regions impacted by Hurricane Ian, the following Administrative Order postponing certain proceedings is hereby RESCINDED: Administrative Order, 2022-MIS-00005 (Chief ALJ Sept. 30, 2022).

This means that—unless a differing tolling period was set by the presiding administrative law judge (ALJ) —the postponement of hearings, and the tolling of deadlines for pre-hearing exchanges, discovery and motion practice, post-hearing briefs and similar matters, ends today, October 28, 2022.

For cases not subject to a contrary tolling period set by the presiding administrative law judge, the tolling period shall be from the date that Hurricane Ian made landfall in Florida on September 28, 2022, through the date of this Administrative Order, October 28, 2022. In other words, time deadlines are extended to the next business day after 31 calendar days from the original deadline. As to rescheduling hearings, however, the presiding ALJ will set the new hearing date.
