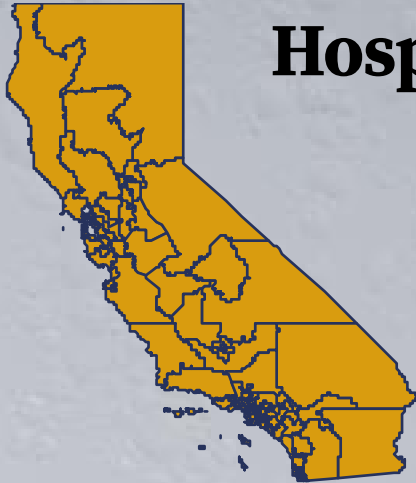

Project Overview

The grant recipient will prioritize service delivery to individuals with multiple barriers to employment, including ex-offenders.



Project Description

The project plans to place underserved workers in the hospitality, construction and retail food industry careers and apprenticeships. It also plans to engage experts in the design and implementation of digital tools, resources and strategies, and explore innovative approaches in the following areas: (1) Outreach & Recruitment; (2) Interests and Need Assessments; (3) Matching Job Seekers to Training/Employment Opportunities; (4) Member Communications; (5) Building Online Learning Management Systems; (6) Career Coaching; (7) Digital Inclusion/Equity Issues; and (8) Data Analysis for Organizational Improvement with the intent of creating a roadmap for investing in a more robust and equitable digital system of performing outreach, training, and job placement.



Project Goals

EWC's goal is to ensure placements with its high-road, signatory employers who offer quality jobs with career ladders, safety standards, worker voice, good industry wages and benefits. The EWC will build a stronger, more resilient LA County positioned to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic by creating 3-industry workforce collaboration representing committed signatory employers.
