The issue is whether appellant had any condition or disability on or after June 24, 1997, causally related to her January 14, 1997 work-related trapezius and lumbar strain.

The Board finds that the decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs' hearing representative dated May 4, 1998 is in accordance with the facts and the law of the case, and hereby adopts the hearing representative's findings and conclusions.

Accordingly, the decisions of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs dated May 4, 1998 and October 22, 1997 are hereby affirmed.¹
