ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

On May 23, 2022 appellant, through counsel, sought an appeal from a purported April 7, 2022 decision of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP).² The Clerk of the Appellate Boards assigned Docket No. 22-0881.

The Board has duly considered the matter and notes that the Board has jurisdiction to review final adverse decisions of OWCP issued under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act (FECA).³ This jurisdiction encompasses any final decision issued by OWCP within 180 days of

No contract for a stipulated fee or on a contingent fee basis will be approved by the Board. *Id.* An attorney or representative's collection of a fee without the Board's approval may constitute a misdemeanor, subject to fine or imprisonment for up to one year or both. *Id.*; *see also* 18 U.S.C. § 292. Demands for payment of fees to a representative, prior to approval by the Board, may be reported to appropriate authorities for investigation.

the date appellant filed her appeal.⁴ The Board notes that the case record does not contain a final adverse decision of OWCP dated April 7, 2022.⁵

As there is no final adverse decision of OWCP, appealed by counsel within 180 days of the filing of this appeal, the Board concludes that the appeal docketed as Docket No. 22-0881 must be dismissed.⁶ Accordingly,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the appeal docketed as No. 22-0881 is dismissed.
