Application Executive Summary

This application requests FFY22 and FFY23 Section 5311 Rural Area Formula funds in the amount of \$ 14,839,552. Funding amounts by sources as follows:

- \$7,419,776 Partial funds from FFY22 Section 5311 apportionment, leaving \$3,511,004 for future use (after allocation of \$2,742,884 to MT-2023-011 and suballocation of \$721,484 to the Blackfeet Nation and \$60,000 to the Chippewa Cree Tribe)
- \$7,419,776 Partial funds from FFY23 Section 5311 apportionment, leaving \$6,921,118 for future use (after suballocation of \$370,415 to the Ft. Peck Tribe and \$60,000 to the Chippewa Cree Tribe).

This award will fund operating assistance, project administration, and preventive maintenance activities for 38 subrecipients, including ICB operators, and state administration activity for the State of Montana Department of Transportation.

Cost Sharing (Match):

Local share will come from various non-federal sources such as cash reserves, state grants, mill levies, donations, in-kind contributions, advertising revenue, and fundraising events. MDT allows the ICB providers to use unsubsidized route cost, net farebox revenue, as in-kind contribution. MDT also allows the rural transit providers to use in-kind contributions as the match. Some examples of in-kind contributions are warehouse parking space, office space, utilities, and service of volunteer drivers that are

provided at no charge to the transit providers and valued at fair market value, documentation is available upon request.

MDT has a signed agreement with FHWA under 23 USC 120(b)(2), making MDT eligible for the higher federal match permitted in Section 120(b)(2) based on the Montana ratio of nontaxable Indian land, public domain lands (reserved and unreserved), national forest, and national parks and monuments to the total area of the state. Pursuant to FTA Circular 9040.1G Page III-17 and Page III-18, MDT uses the sliding scale match ratio for operating assistance (ALI 30.09.02) of 54.11% federal to 45.89% local share for rural transit and intercity bus providers.

Pre-award authority will be used for this application. The estimated expenditures through December 31, 2023, is \$6,701,875 in Federal Share and \$3,604,959 in Local Share. The estimated Unliquidated Obligations is \$8,137,677 in Federal Share and \$4,249,913 in Local Share.
