Application Executive Summary

This application requests FY2021 Section 5311 Tribal Transit Competitive funds apportioned to the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation, California in the amount of \$612,000.

Discretionary ID: D2022-TRTR-018

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation requested \$612,000 in funding to purchase one new battery electric shuttle bus and to purchase and install one DC fast charger. The new vehicle is necessary to an replace an older gasoline-powered shuttle that has exceeded its useful life.

The existing shuttle was purchased as a used vehicle and has high mileage. Staff and customers have also complained about inadequate air conditioning on the bus, which is a public health concern in an area that can easily reach 110 F in the summer. The new shuttle will be critical to maintain the same level of service that the Tribe currently provides to Tribal citizens, staff, and the public.

The project's original scope was to purchase two (2) electric shuttles and to purchase and install one (1) DC fast charger and one (1) Level 2 AC charger. The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation requested to change the scope of the project by reducing the number of electric shuttles purchased from two (2) to one (1) and only purchasing and installing one (1) DC fast charger. The original budget of the grant included \$612,000 of FY21 Tribal Transit Program funds with no match required. Due to rising manufacturing costs, the price for an electric shuttle increased significantly from \$241,000 to \$350,000 for a new 14-passenger ADA electric shuttle. The cost of a DC fast charger and electrical installation is estimated to cost \$467,000. As a result, costs exceed the initial \$612,000 grant request. Without the approved change in scope, the Tribe would not be able to purchase any shuttles or chargers due to the high out-of-pocket costs to the Tribe. The request approved by FTA, see attached email.

Bus Replacement (Capital)

This grant applies \$350,000 to bus replacement. We will purchase one new battery electric 14-passenger ADA lift-equipped shuttle bus.

Award Description

Purpose

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation, a federally-recognized tribal government, currently has an existing fleet of diesel and gasoline shuttles that serve as the only public transit option on Tribal lands. The shuttles run a 24-hour, 365-day per year fixed route service on the Tribe's Cache Creek Casino Resort property. The goal of the Project is to replace one older gasoline-powered shuttle that has exceeded its useful life with one electric ADA shuttle and install one DC fast charger to power the new shuttle. The Project will address

state of good repair needs and ensure continued 24/7 fixed route and on-demand services to essential job and community sites for Tribal citizens, employees, and the public.

Activities to be performed:

Project activities include purchasing one new electric shuttle and purchasing and installing one DC fast charger to replace one older gasoline-powered shuttle.

Expected outcomes:

The Project will ensure safe and reliable transportation for nearly 20,000 riders annually, including Tribal citizens, employees, and the public, to important points of work and community services. The shuttles will be ADA lift-equipped and air conditioned for safety and accessibility.

By replacing an older gasoline-powered passenger bus with a new zero emissions shuttle, the Project will also reduce greenhouse gas emissions, supporting Tribal, county, and state climate action goals and help improve air quality and public health for the surrounding area. The Project is also anticipated to reduce annual operations and maintenance costs for the transit fleet. Savings were previously estimated to be approximately 85% in the form of fuel, oil, and other savings.

Intended beneficiaries:

The free transit service is available to Tribal and Cache Creek Casino Resort employees, and the general public, and includes stops at essential job and service stations such as the Casino, gas station/mini-mart, engineering facilities, resort operation offices, Yocha Dehe Golf Club, a regional transit bus stop, and the Yocha Dehe Fire Department. As one of the largest employers in Yolo County, California, the Tribe employs approximately 2,500 people who have access to the free onsite transit services, and many are reliant on the Tribe's public transit once on site. In addition, thousands of customers visit the Resort every day, often on group tour buses, meaning they must utilize the free onsite shuttle service to get around the property.

Project Description

This application requests FY2021 Section 5311 Tribal Transit Competitive funds apportioned to the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation, California in the amount of \$612,000.

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation requested \$612,000 in funding to purchase one new battery electric 14-passenger ADA lift-equipped shuttle bus and to purchase and install one DC fast charger and supporting infrastructure. The new vehicle is necessary to replace an old gasoline-powered shuttle that has exceeded its useful life. The gas-powered shuttle being replaced is a 2013 Ford E-450 Glaval Universal 22 (Bus ID # 21) with 289,000 miles, VIN# 1FDFE4FS9DDA50904. Once replaced with the new shuttle, the old gas shuttle will be disposed of in accordance with federal regulations.

The specifications of the new shuttle are as follows: 2024 Ford Terra Transit EPIC4 Electric Shuttle Bus CA 158" WB 14 Passenger, Electric Entry Door with Exterior Key Switch, 75K BTU ACC A/C System, 20, 500 Rear Hydronic Heater, Altro Flooring, Battery Disconnect Switch, 2 Way Radio Prep, OEM Radio with 4 Speakers, 2 AMF Bruns Securement System, Level 4 Freedman 6 Mid-High Fixed Doubles, 1 Mid-High Foldaway Seat, Exterior Remote Power Mirrors, USR Retractable Seat Belts. The shuttle meets the Buy America requirement.

The existing shuttle was purchased as a used vehicle and has high mileage. Staff and customers have also complained about inadequate air conditioning on the bus, which is a public health concern in an area that can easily reach 110 F in the summer. The new shuttle will be critical to maintain the same level of service that the Tribe currently provides to Tribal citizens, staff, and the public.

Sponsor Rationale: Due to rising manufacturing costs, the price for an electric shuttle increased significantly from \$241,000 to \$350,000 for a new 14-passenger ADA electric shuttle. The cost of a DC fast charger and electrical installation is estimated to cost \$467,000. As a result, costs exceed the initial \$612,000 grant request. Without the approved change in scope, the Tribe would not be able to purchase any shuttles or chargers due to the high out-of-pocket costs to the Tribe.

Location Description

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation (Yocha Dehe or Tribe) is a federally recognized tribal government with jurisdiction over transportation through ownership and operation of transit vehicles and equipment. The Tribe's lands are located in the Capay Valley in western Yolo County, California. The Tribe operates a fixed route and on-demand shuttle service for tribal citizens, employees, and the general public on a 24/7 schedule on and around the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation's lands.
