Application Executive Summary

This is a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) FFY 2023 Section 5311 application in the federal amount of \$22,602,093 including Section 5311(b3) Rural Transportation Assistance Program and Section 5311(f) Intercity Bus Transportation program funds. This grant is a partial obligation for FFY 2023 Section 5311 for \$11,896,678, full obligation of the Section 5311(b)(3) Rural Transportation Assistance Program for \$378,493, and full obligation of the FFY 2022 Section 5311 formula lapsing funds \$10,326,922; a total of \$22,602,093 of the FFY 2023 Section 5311 apportionment which totals a federal amount of \$23,550, 109. The remaining allocation will be obligated by FDOT in a separate future grant application.
