This is in response to your continuing hardship exemption request for Greater Kansas City Building and Construction Trades Council, AFL-CIO, LM File No. The fiscal year ending December 31, 2007. Your request dated April 14, 2008 was received by the Office of Labor-Management Standards (OLMS) on April 18, 2008. A continuing hardship exemption request requires the requesting union to demonstrate that it cannot file Form LM-2 electronically without undue burden or expense.

Your request for a continuing hardship exemption was based upon the following information stated in your letter:

Your local has made multiple attempts to file electronically, but has been unable to, despite receiving technical support from OLMS and DigiTrust. You were advised that the file was corrupt.

OLMS grants your continuing hardship exemption request for filing Form LM-2 electronically for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2007, based on the information provided. Please note that this continuing hardship exemption approval applies only to the fiscal year ending December 31, 2007.

Your letter indicated that you have already sent a paper copy of the Form LM-2 within the specified timeframe for filing. According to OLMS records, however, your report has not been received as of this writing. I might point out that until this report is received, the union is considered delinquent.
